Guidelines

Posts on the LCSB website are helpful, not self-promotional. No jargon or corporate speak. Keep it interesting and conversational.

The posts should adhere to LCSB’s policy of tolerance: freedom to express your perspective and story whilst maintaining an openness and respect for the personal and denominational beliefs of others.

Word count:

- 400-600 words

Format for sharing:

- Share a Google doc or email a Word doc.

Links:

- Link to other content whenever relevant. Every link included must add value for readers.

Formatting:

- Keep paragraphs short. Avoid using big blocks of text.
- Indent quotations longer than 40 words.
- Use headers and sub-headers to break up your post.
- When writing headlines, be specific and indicate a benefit to the reader.
- Use bullet or numbered lists.

Images:

We love images on the LCSB blog. We use them to break up text, make the blog post scannable and to support data. Ideally, we include one image at every scroll depth, so an image is always visible.

Editing:

We may edit your post or bounce it back to you for revisions.

Deadline:

We ask that your articles be submitted 7 days prior to your scheduled run date. Don’t worry, we’ll coordinate a date together.
